World peace. Reality or illusion?

The military and civilian contribution

- As defined in the White Paper: 'Especially in times of crisis and transitions, such as the one we are currently
 experiencing, the strong and vital connection that must exist between the Armed Forces and the country's other
 instruments of action and between the military and the rest of the citizens is of fundamental importance, in order to
 achieve that interpenetration between the different parts of the same organism that is functional to the very life of our
 community, in order to maintain peace and serenity within society'.
- Military and governmental aid, with the help of local authorities, is an optimal response against the ravages that wars and interests of various kinds can bring upon populations. Consequently, action is needed to prevent disasters, through ratification of agreements and humanitarian peace actions. With cyclical disasters linked to climate change, it is necessary for everyone, from governments to the military and civilians, to work together to ensure that the world, its resources and exploited states are protected for a better and more prosperous future. Consequently, the world, governments and armies must face up to this issue and implement all necessary measures with the aim of controlling the use of these resources and territories within limits, in order to avoid their depletion and desertification through global warming.
