# 3.2 A "short detailed" history of UN

The United Nations is one of the most famous civilian organizations, known as a worldwide peacekeeper, with the headquarters in New York. The first ever idea to found the UN came on the 1st of January 1942, from Franklin Roosevelt, a former US president. By that time (as nowadays) the purpose of society was to focus on maintaining or establishing peace, controlling climate change and encouraging development. However, the organization was officially created on the 24th of October 1945, after the Allies won the First World War. Since then, this date has been considered the "United Nations Day".

It is widely admitted that the UN might be the greatest organization that has ever existed, consisting of almost 200 member countries and six official languages: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish.<sup>7</sup>

After the resonant and at some point unexpected victory of the Allies in the World War 1, a colossal idea, which changed the entire fate of the world, came across

Woodrow Wilson's (a former American president) mind: the modelling of a peacemaker society. So, without losing any time, the first organization in the permanent pursuit of harmony was created in the early twenties in Paris, and it was called the League of Nations. Nowadays, it seems the rightful thing for such an organization to exist, but back in those dark times, it was truly a great challenge to create a peacekeeping society. As I said before, the first time when this name was mentioned, was in 1942, when the officials of 26 states met to sign the "Declaration of United Nations". However, the decisive meeting was on 26th of June 1945 in San Francisco, where 50 state representatives signed the treaty. Nowadays, the UN includes 193 countries and 36 specialized agencies, programs and partnerships.<sup>8</sup>

knows, the UN main purpose is to maintain peace, so a good idea for keeping the worldwide harmony might be to avoid poverty and to strengthen children's rights. According to the latest estimations, in 2015, 10 percent of the world's population, more than half a billion, lived with less than 1.90 dollars a day. By the end of 2030, one of the main goals of the organization is to conclude global poverty, maintaining this percentage somewhere below than 3.<sup>10</sup> According to the UN officials, they would succeed to do it only by finding a decent job to literally everyone, integrating every citizen of this world socially and declining inequality. This is undoubtedly one of the greatest challenges that the organization has ever faced, but through the understanding that the United Nations and the state rulers have shown, this peacekeeping action might become easier to be achieved.

The UN succeeded one more time to cooperate with all their member countries, promoting peace and harmony, in order to solve one of the greatest issues nowadays.
